

The Cape Point & Peninsula Tour

(Full Day Tour with guided walk fishing community)

Scheduled Tour

Tour description

- This is an opportunity to discover local inhabitants of the Peninsula as well as the world-renowned reserves, fauna and flora.
- A real highlight is to learn about one of the oldest working fishing harbours accompanied by a local from the fishing community whose stories and anecdotes of local heritage over a cup of indigenous tea or on a leisurely walk offer guests more insight into the Peninsula and its inhabitants¹.
- Visitors soak up the magnificent landscapes of the Atlantic coastline and Hout Bay with its stunning views from breath-taking *Chapman's Peak Drive* en route to world-renowned Cape Point situated in the Cape of Good Hope Nature Reserve.
- With its selection of fauna (such as antelope, zebra, baboons and ostrich, at least 250 species of wild birds) and its flora (approximately 1 100 indigenous plant species, some of which are unique to this area) this World Heritage Site is a *must-see*. Historic Simon's Town is another stop en route. It boasts wonderful Victorian architecture and the Penguin colony of Boulders Beach, in the Cape Peninsula National Park.

Tour includes:

- Transport return CTICC.
- Accredited guide from pick-up to drop-off.
- Drive via Atlantic Sea Board, Hout Bay and Chapman's Peak Drive²
- Toll Fee for Chapman's Peak when open to the public.
- Entrance fees for Cape of Good Hope Nature Reserve and Boulders Penguin Colony.
- Guided walk (or teatime) with host from fishing village (Hout Bay or Kalk Bay)³.

Tour excludes:

- Meals and beverages
- An obligatory 10 – 15% service fee on tables of 8 or more guests added to the final lunch bill by the restaurant. This is strictly for the charge of the guests.
- Any purchases of a personal nature and gratuities.

Please note:

- For the purpose of the itinerary, we recommend having lunch at "Boulders Restaurant" with its view of the sea, great food and tranquil atmosphere. **Booking** for the restaurant is **essential** and a service offered free-of-charge to Andulela's clients. **Meals and refreshments are for the client's account**. Please let us know in advance if there are any special dietary requirements (vegetarians, food allergies, vegans, Halaal, Kosher, etc). The restaurant will do its best to accommodate any special requirements.
- We recommend you bring: sun-&wind protection and a jersey no matter what the weather at departure!!! Cape weather can change several times in one day!
- Guests are requested not to:
 - a) feed or interfere in any way with the baboons or any other wild animal en route
 - b) pick or interfere with the natural vegetation that is protected by law and any tampering with either flora or fauna is subject to a fine issued by local authorities. Andulela and its partners will not take any responsibility for fines or prosecution in what so ever.
